1. Introduction

Papers, in **PDF format**, should be submitted to the EasyChair online submission system. Please find the submission deadlines on the conference website: <https://www.caspt-transitdata2027.conf.kth.se/>. Please note that the paper should be in **English**.

2. Format

Set the format of the paper as follows:

- Font: 11pt. Times New Roman Bold, underline, or italics may be used as needed. (using style 'Normal' will be easier)
- Spacing: Single spacing for all text material, with one line between paragraphs.
- Margins: 25mm (1 inch) margins top, bottom, left and right.
- Page numbers: bottom centre
- Page size: ISO A4 (210 x 297mm / 8.25" x 11.75")
- Number of pages : 8 pages maximum for regular papers, 4 pages for short communication papers (including references and appendix)

3. Sections

The main section should be numbered and typed in 14pt, bold, allcaps, times new roman, left justified (using style 'heading 1' will be easier). Two blank lines above main headings, and 1 blank line below.

3.1 Subsections

Subheadings should be numbered and typed in bold 12pt., Times New Roman, initial caps, left justified (using style 'heading 2' will be easier). One blank line above and below.

3.2 Sub-subsections

Sub-subheadings should be numbered and typed in bold 11pt. Times New Roman typeface, initial caps, left justified (using style 'heading 3' will be easier). One blank line above and below.

4. Paper Structure

4.1 Cover page

The first page of the short paper should contain the following, and in the order specified below:

- Paper title: 24pt, Times New Roman typeface, bold, centre justification, small capital.
- Authors: List author details in 11 point bold including names (the main author listed first), with current affiliations, addresses, and email address(es). The corresponding author should be highlighted by "*".
- Abstract: Less than 100 words
- Keywords: up to five

4.2. Main text

There are no specific requirements for the main text. However, the following structure will be suitable in many cases:

- Introduction
- Methodology
- Data source (if any)
- Results
- References
- Acknowledgment (optional)

The format of equations, tables and figures will be described in the next section.

5. EQUATIONS, Tables And Figures

5.1 Equations

All equations must be numbered and have to appear in the following format:

$$a^2 + b^2 = c^2 \quad (1)$$

5.2 Tables and figures

Tables, figures should be numbered sequentially, with a caption in bold, 11 pt. as shown below:

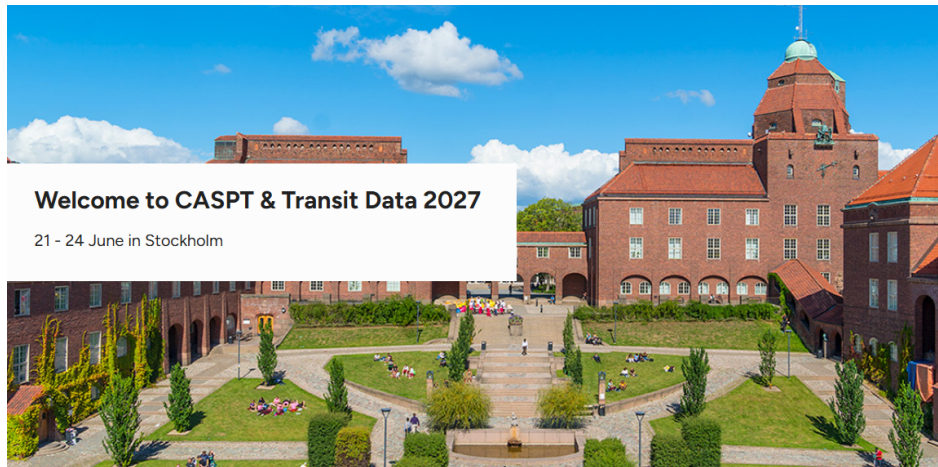


Figure 1: Sample of figure

All tables, figures, and illustrations must be electronically formatted and embedded within the document.

6. References

References should follow the APA style the name of the author and the year of the publication of the reference should be given in the text. Example citation: (Ortúzar & Willumsen, 2011). If the same author has written two or more publications in the same year, they should be differentiated by the letters a, b, c etc. For references with more than two authors, text citations should be shortened to the first author followed by *et al.* Use hanging indents in typing the references.

References should be listed in alphabetical order at the end of the article. References by the same author should be in chronological order. Journal references like (Ma et al., 2020) should include author's surname and initials, surnames and initials of remaining authors, year of the publication in brackets, article title (if provided), journal title (in italic), volume number, page numbers, and DOI (if provided).
